### **Telling the Full Story: Power and Presence in Public**

Join Dr. Paul Farber, Director and Co-Founder of Monument Lab, as he delves into the ever-evolving relationship between public space and public memory in his upcoming talk, "Telling the Full Story: Power and Presence in Public." Farber contends we can summon an evolving and more healing relationship to the past by transcending the idea that monuments function solely as static platforms for public art and history. Through an exploration of the strategies and methods utilized by artists and public constituencies, Farber will shed light on how monument landscapes can be transformed into sites of healing and repair.

Farber will share insights from his scholarly and public projects, including Monument Lab's work in the field of community, municipal, and contemporary art. Balancing the ideas of imprint and erasure, he explores case studies where communities have challenged themselves to tackle complex legacies of injustice inscribed into public spaces and institutional frameworks. Farber will address issues of permanence, power, and participation in commemorative work. As a part of this event, Monument Lab will lead attendees in a "storyform" exercise that explores the question: "What Stories Belong in Robinson Park?"
